Champion of the Chimpanzees

- 1. Dr. Jane Goodall is a scientist best known for her studies of chimpanzees. Among other things, her research has shown that chimpanzees hunt for meat and use tools.
- 2. Jane was born in England in 1934. She was passionate about animals from a very early age. On her second birthday, she was given a toy chimpanzee named Jubilee, which she loved. She also enjoyed reading books about animals. Jane's dream was to travel to Africa to live and work among the animals. But in the 1940s, this seemed to be something quite impossible for a girl to do. However, Jane was encouraged by her mother, who told her that if she really interested and worked towards it, anything was possible.
- 3. After she left school, Jane trained and worked as a secretary. A friend invited her to visit Kenya. Jane worked hard to raise enough money for her fare and in 1956, she finally made it to Africa. There she met Dr. Louis Leaky, a famous scientist. She worked as an assistant under him. After several months, he asked Jane to begin a study of wild chimpanzees in Gombe Stream National Park in Tanzania. Jane jumped at the chance and in 1960 she arrived in Tanzania.
- 4. Jane conducted research on chimpanzees. Jane made many discoveries about chimpanzees. One of the most important was her observation that chimpanzees use tools. They were stripping leaves from twigs and then poking the twigs into termite nests to fish out the termites to eat.
- 5. In 1965, Jane went back to England and studied at Cambridge University, where eventually graduated as a doctor of science. In 1977, she established the Jane Goodall Institute. The overall mission of the institute is to 'advance the power of individuals to take informed and compassionate action to improve the environment of all living things'. One of its key aims is to protect chimpanzees and their environments.
- 6. Today Jane travels around the world to talk about her work and inspire young people to make a difference to their lives and to the Earth. 
