Climbing the Everest

- On May 23, 2001 a class VIII student's dream became a reality when at 7:04 a.m. he stepped on the summit of the mighty Mount Everest. Temba Tsheri was just 16 years and 32 days old. During the brief ten minutes at the top, Temba savoured his triumph and gazed on all below. He posed for the customary photograph and then began the descent.
- 2. Growing up in the shade of Mount Gaurishankar, young Temba was exposed to tales of adventure. Hordes of sturdy men of the mountains who join expedition groups would tell about their climbing. The amazing experiences of those men in the high Himalayas stimulated the imagination of Temba.
- 3. Temba attended a village school that was a day's walk from the village. He and his younger brother Nima Narru would help their mother plant potatoes or graze the cattle while their father and elder brother would be away for days while accompanying trekking groups. Then the family moved to Kathmandu. Temba joined a basic mountaineering course and set his mind on his life's ambition to scale the Everest.
- 4. For three years, the close-knit Sherpa family was caught up in Temba's dream of becoming the youngest person to climb the highest peak. Climbing from the south side the previous spring season, Temba was forced to turn back just 50 metres short of the summit, owing to bad weather and five frost-bitten fingers. He later lost them in an operation in Kathmandu hospital. But the ill prepared attempt of 2000 taught the boy a serious lesson; climbing the highest mountain peak was not child's play. It required focus, tremendous will power, and a strong support group.
- 5. There was no dissuading the young boy, he still wanted to have a go. His father, Chhouwa Sherpa accompanied the boy on both occasions as expedition kitchen staff. He carried the gear to the higher camps, a mammoth task in the oxygen rarefied atmosphere of the peaks. He felt tormented each time he watched his young son disappear behind the mountains.
- 6. In his triumphant homecoming, Temba received an overwhelming reception from his family, friends and admirers. The accolades coming the way of this schoolboy were

many. He broke the record of Bertrand Roche, a French climber who reached the summit at the age of 17. That was in 1990. Roche was the first to congratulate the boy.

7. Roche was at the base camp after setting a record. He and his wife, Claire, members of the International Tibet Everest Expedition 2001, successfully paraglided from the summit to the base camp in a record of eight minutes. Temba, who was at 7000 metres, got a glimpse of the couple as they wove their way down in the wind. He was preparing for his final ascent to the mountain peak. Shortly afterwards, the young boy had made his tryst with destiny.
